The Hooksett Summer Enrichment Program offers a rich, hands-on experience for students entering grades 4 through 8. Each class is designed for a specific grade span.

Classes are held Mondays through Thursdays from July 6 to July 30. Some classes are four weeks in length; other offerings are for two weeks. Each day there are two sessions. The first session is from 8:00am - 10:00am and the second session is from 10:15am - 12:15pm.

Enrollees are accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Classes that do not meet the minimum enrollment will be cancelled. Parents will be notified by Wednesday, June 3rd if a class has been cancelled. Full refunds will be given if cancelled due to lack of enrollment.

Students' fees fund the program; classes must be paid in advance. A registration fee of \$5.00 is needed to offset additional costs to start and run the program.

Students become very engaged in learning with Minecraft with the many subjects that can be taught. The school owns a copy of Minecraft for Schools and hosts its own Minecraft server which is completely controlled by the teacher. Minecraft "worlds" are set up with goals and lessons that require critical and creative thinking. This two week offering will begin with tutorials that will help new and less experienced users to get acclimated to the Minecraft universe with more experienced users encouraged to help teach. Lessons will all revolve around educational lesson plans and slowly become more complex and involved over the course.

Create your own interactive stories, animated adventures, creative comics, and games using Scratch, an online drag and drop programming application developed by MIT. Scratch introduces students to programming with an easy to learn and use but powerful interface. Students can let their imaginations take hold as they learn the essential building blocks of programming. This two week offering will start with the basics with more experienced students helping new and less experienced students. Students will then dive into both group and individual projects. This is a great way for students to not only learn programming but to collaboratively work together as well as learn some basics of project management.
