Robotics

The robotics team had a great performance at the regional qualifying tournament in November at Hillside Middle School. There were 18 teams competing and the Cawley team won the robot game, received a second place trophy for Core Values, and earned a spot at the state tournament to be held in Windham on December 3.

ALPs News:

As part of the Hour of Code this year Cawley students are participating in the first ever NH Cyber-Robotics Coding Competition co-sponsored by NH Department of Education and Intelitek. This challenge is open to all middle and high school students in New Hampshire. The first stage of the competition runs until December 4. In order to advance to the semi-finals the ALPS teachers have been focusing on encouraging as many students and teachers to log in and complete at least five of the fifty missions. Currently, Cawley is in ninth place, but climbing the leaderboard quickly.

The sixth-grade students in 21st Century Technology class had the opportunity to show off their coding skills for Ido Yerushalimi, the CEO from Intelitek, as he visited and interacted with the students as they completed challenges.

Eighth grade students participated in the Water Warrior Challenge in their science classes. This was an authentic learning experience that included a STEM component of inventing a product that will protect a small house from flash flooding. After testing the absorbency rates of different materials students advanced through the design process. Many students were successful on their second and third attempts after reflecting on the difficulties of their first model.

Young South East Asian Leaders Initiative

On October 27, Cawley's sixth grade social studies classes hosted three international visitors from the Hooksett YSEALI (Young South East Asian Leaders Initiative) program. This mutually beneficial learning experience provided students with an opportunity to think critically about Hooksett's role in the global community.
