Report Cards

Fifth to Sixth Grade Orientation

Incoming fifth graders will be touring Cawley Middle School on Wednesday, June 6. Students will be introduced to their homeroom teachers and administration. That evening, starting at 5:30 pm and ending at 7:30 pm there will be a dance and carnival for current fifth and sixth grade students. There will be a parent orientation in the Cawley Media Center from 6:30 pm – 7:30 pm. This presentation will provide an overview of the academic and extra curricular programs offered for all students.

Memorial Day Activities

On Friday, May 18, local resident John Cooperider spoke to 7th and 8th grade students. Mr. Cooperider, a 20 year Navy veteran recalled his childhood and relayed first hand accounts during his Navy career. He told students about his duties during the Bay of Pigs and Cuban Missile Crisis in his capacity as assistant to the Secretary of the Navy. Mr. Cooperider also talked about some of his overseas assignments in Madrid and Norway, which included his dealings with spies. Students enjoyed hearing about his experiences and being able to ask questions. In addition, 7th grader Autumn Wood led the Cawley community in the Pledge of Allegiance and also provided the meaning of Memorial Day along with reading the poem, "Flanders Fields." The student body remained standing as Mr. Davini played "Taps" on the trumpet.
