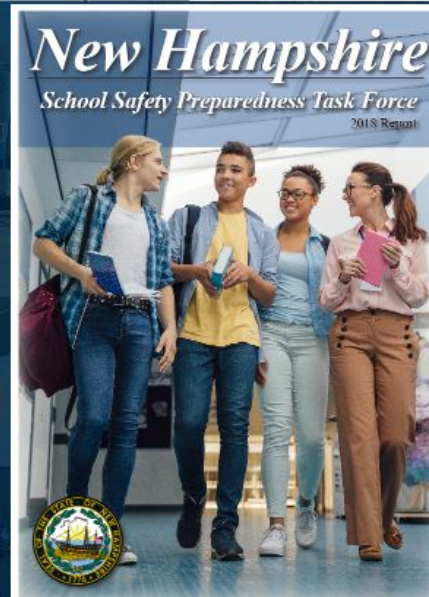

Purpose of a School Emergency Operations Plan

- To align schools' emergency planning efforts with the emergency planning practices at the national, state, and local levels. Required by NH RSA 189:64
- To stop an emergency from occurring or reducing the impact of an incident through preventative and protective measures.
- To provide first aid, notify response partners, and provide instructions before first responders arrive.
- To collaborate with their community partners to provide a cohesive, coordinated response through their emergency operations plan.

Areas of Preparedness



Emergency Operations Plan Development

- Developing the Emergency Operations Plan is a multi-step process that involves collaboration, careful analysis of various hazards/threats, goals and objectives, actions, implementation, and practice/maintenance/review.
- Key Features of the EOP
 - *Incident Command System*
 - *Assignment of Roles and Responsibilities.*
 - *Incident Commander*
 - *Emergency Response Actions*

- First response to any and all types of emergencies, including terrorism, natural disasters, etc.



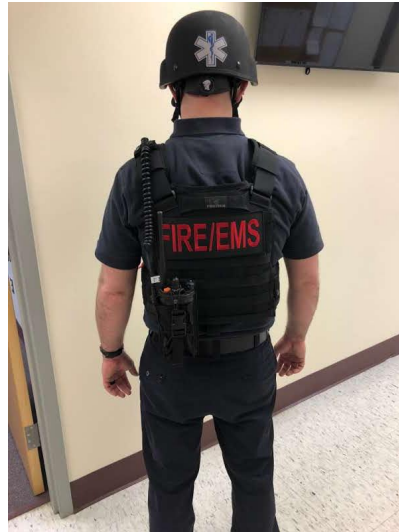


