National Junior Honor Society

The Cawley Middle School Chapter of National Junior Honors Society is excited for the 2022-2023 school year. NWEA Testing

All Cawley students were assessed in reading and math using the NWEA test from September 14 – September 16. The data will be used to guide teachers in planning core instruction and target learning gaps. Students will also be taking the math and reading NWEA test in June. The goal is for all students to meet or exceed their targeted growth at the end of the school year.

Student Presentations

As a part of the NH Bullying Law, the Cawley Administration presented to all students regarding bullying in the first week of school. These in-depth presentations provided students with strategies to identify bullying, stop bullying and treat others with respect and kindness. In addition, the administration presented the emergency management drills to all students.

High School Information Night

This year's annual High School Information Night was on September 12. During the informational night I outlined the process for parents and students that detailed the process for students transitioning to high school.

After the informational presentation, representatives from Pinkerton Academy spoke about the school's academic co-curricular and athletic programs and also provided valuable information about the transition to high school.

Students may petition to attend one of the schools that the Hooksett School District has a Memorandum of Understanding with if the percentage of students petitioning does not go below 63.26% of 8th grade students attending Pinkerton Academy.

8th Grade Trip to Washington D.C.

On September 19, there was an informational meeting for parents and students regarding this year's 8th grade trip to Washington D.C. in the Cawley gymnasium. This year's 8th grade trip to Washington D.C. is scheduled from Tuesday, April 18 to Friday, April 22, 2023. At the meeting Principal, Matthew Benson, Assistant Principal, Karin Rogers, Washington D.C. ImPACT Concussion Testing

On September 30, Cawley Middle School will be offering ImPACT testing for students who are 12 years and older free of cost. ImPACT testing is a computerized exam that measures cognitive functions such as memory, processing and reaction time. This

test is used by healthcare professionals to determine a child's readiness to return to play after a head injury. This first test provides a baseline that is used for comparison if a head injury is suspected.

Title I

The Cawley Title I program is gearing up to offer services for students who are at risk of or have fallen below grade level expectations in the areas of reading and math.

Title I will be offered in the afternoons weekly from Monday - Thursday from 2:45 - 3:45pm. Once fall NWEA testing is completed, more students will be invited to the program based on this data point along with others including teaching recommendation. This summer seven students participated in the Title I program and received support in reading and math.

Athletics
